white / dumpy tree frog care sheet





#### habitat

10-20 gallon tank with secure lid. Provide large pieces of driftwood, artificial non-toxic plants, bark and branches with enough room to climb. Fine, particulate soil or ground coconut fiber (Advised not to use mulch/wood chips because they might get stuck in the frog's throat when eating). Make sure to use soil that retains moisture. Provide fresh clean chlorine-free water in a large shallow bowl daily.



### lighting

Provide a basking lamp. Tree frogs do not require lighting.



### temperature

Temperature should range from 68 at night, 75° to 80°F during the day.



#### diet

Live gut-loaded crickets and worms. They can also eat pinkies or fuzzies. Sprinkle insects with calcium daily and with a mineral supplement once or twice a week.
